

• Conference at Chapman University in January 2024: Is Philosophy Useful for Science, and/or Vice Versa?

The international conference will take place at Chapman University from January 30 to February 2, 2024. This inaugural conference of the MPP graduate program (D.Sc. in Mathematics, Philosophy and Physics) is organized by Marco Panza, Thomas Pradeu, and Dean Michael Ibba. who will gather an outstanding group of prominent scientists and philosophers of science whose presentations will explore the issue of how philosophy and science can learn from each other and crossfertilize. The topics and tools, as well as the successes and failures of a reconnection between philosophy and science will be examined and discussed.

Graduate Program

Opening of new graduate program in Mathematics, Philosophy, and Physics (MPP) at Chapman University

The new D.Sc. program in Mathematics, Philosophy, and Physics begins in the Fall 2023 semester at Chapman Univer-

sity. Offered by the Schmid College of Science and Technology, the MPP Program is an innovative post-master's-level, cross-disciplinary research doctoral program focusing on the foundational pillars of the sciences. Following traditions dating back to Plato, the program emphasizes the fundamental relationship between mathematics, philosophy, and the physical sciences. Marco Panza, Program Director, has developed and co-founded the program with other Chapman faculty members from each representative department of Mathematics, Philosophy, and Physics, and will begin teaching, advising, and supervising doctoral research in Fall 2023.
